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- **Application Form** – assessed against the application form, curriculum vitae and letter of support. - **Supporting Statements** - applicants are asked to provide a statement to demonstrate how they meet the criteria. The response will be “scored” as part of the shortlisting process.
- **Interview** – assessed during the interview process by either competency based interview questions, tests or presentation etc.
