As such, it is a largely teaching and supervisory role.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Under the guidance of the Research Director: to join with the research team in the development and monitoring of the clinical psychology research programme • To supervise autonomously research projects conducted by trainees on the DClinPsy Programme. • To supervise projects primarily relating to own research field (although supervision in other areas related to clinical psychology is sometimes required). • To be an active member of the programme team, being involved in a full range of course activities including admissions, trainee monitoring and other key tasks. • To participate, with other Programme staff, in the management of the Contract held with the funding body. • To have responsibility for the organisation of certain aspects of the Programme which may vary according to changing priorities but which include: all aspects of planning, monitoring and supporting the research programme and involvement with related examination requirements. • To provide teaching in research and other areas of expertise. • To assist and participate in the selection of trainees. • To attend appropriate Programme committees. • With other staff, and in liaison with NHS psychologists, to help provide for the personal support and development needs of Programme trainees. • To participate in the development and management of student appraisal procedures. • To carry out duties and/or undertake responsibilities relating to Health and Safety in accordance with University policies. • Undertake any other duties as directed by Head of Division, Programme/Research Director or nominated representative.
