Major duties: teaching, research, and academic leadership and engagement

- Lead (Grade 8) on elements of/Contribute (Grade 7) towards all aspects of the teaching of Professional Practice, Values and Ethics (Medical Law, Ethics, and Professionalism) within Lancaster Medical School through Interprofessional Learning facilitation, Workshops, Debates, and Lectures.
- Contribute to existing undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in Lancaster Medical School through Problem-Based Learning facilitation, and Special Study Modules.
- Lead (Grade8) on aspects of/Contribute (Grade 7) towards all aspects of the assessment of the Professional Practice, Values and Ethics (Medical Law, depending on area of expertise, Ethics and Professionalism) through exams and coursework, including assessment writing, marking, moderation, and board attendance, depending on area of expertise.
- Lead (Grade 8) on elements of/Contribute (Grade 7) towards reviewing the existing Professional Practice,
 Values and Ethics curriculum and recommended resources (including Medical Law, Ethics and
 Professionalism) within Lancaster Medical School, depending on area of expertise.
- Develop a programme of research in a field relevant to Medical Law, Ethics or Professionalism.
- Obtain research funding commensurate with others in your field and at your career stage.
- Publish in international peer-reviewed academic journals and produce other appropriate forms of research output.
- Supervise undergraduate and postgraduate dissertation projects and form part of the supervisory team for PhD students.
- Fulfil the duties of Admissions Tutor, assisting the Director of Admissions with all aspects of selection and
 admission to the undergraduate medical and foundation year programmes, including review of admission
 criteria and selection processes. The role holder will contribute to all stages of the complex admissions
