Undertake the day-to-day management of the social science aspects of the research to support Professor Cleaver and project partners in developing insights which can be used to address problems of contested water resources and pollution. 2. Contribute to the development of themes, approaches and methods across the project and in particular to the development of a robust approach to transdisciplinary cross-case learning. 3. Undertake short-term targeted fieldwork in selected project countries in collaboration with country partners, to strengthen case development of case studies, as required. 4. Collate and organize qualitative and quantitative data; undertake joint data analysis with project partners. 5. Promote communication and joint learning within project team and play a key role in organising and facilitating project workshops and meetings. 6. Contribute to writing of project outputs (academic publications, blogs, website, policy briefs). Maintain a consistently high output of international quality publications and research briefs, co-authored with project partners. 7. Facilitate dissemination and engagement activities both internally and externally to the university. Present findings and papers at national and international academic conferences and contribute to the visibility of the project and of University of Lancaster. 8. Further career development opportunities include the possibility of teaching on undergraduate and postgraduate modules and on field classes. 9. The post holder will be encouraged to develop an independent research profile, with advice and guidance from the PI's and taking into account the needs of the project. 10.
