- **Application Form** – assessed against the application form, curriculum vitae, and letter of support. Applicants will not be asked to make a specific supporting statement. This is normally used to evaluate factual evidence, e.g. award of a PhD. Applicants will be “scored” as part of the shortlisting process.

- **Supporting Statements** – applicants are asked to provide a statement to demonstrate how they meet the criteria. The response will be “scored” as part of the shortlisting process.
- **Interview** – assessed during the interview process by, for example, competency-based interview questions, tests, presentations, etc.
